

2020-21 CHAIRS REPORT

At the AGM, all positions are open for election/re-election - anyone in the school community can put themselves forward for a committee role.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Worked with the School to complete the new ICT Suite
- Raised over £10k for the school during a pandemic
- Successfully organised several fundraising events during a year throughout a constantly changing situation
- Introduced 2 new events, Harpenden Pumpkin Trail & Jingle Bell Walk, which engaged the community and raised approximately £1500 cumulatively
- Not allowing COVID to put a stop to annual events like Comedy Night & Easter Egg Hunt
- Built upon the working relationship between FoHA and the School
- Supported the school's requests by purchasing playground equipment (basketball, foam rugby balls, coloured playground chalk, dominoes for each class & water tray), New Netball Posts & Nets, Welcome Gifts for New Ladybirds, Welcome back balloons & treats
- Provided financial support so that the school can continue utilising Empiribox & Bug Club, both are valuable educational programmes
- The shed has been built and now stores all FoHA event items
- Held six well-attended Summer Picnics between July & August for the entire HA community.

LOWLIGHTS

- Due to pandemic, there was a lack of face-to-face social events
- Challenging to build a community with the limitations on events
- Losing some money at the last minute cancelation of day 2 of the Jingle Bell Walk
- Cancelation of the Summer Social Event.







2020-21 EVENTS RECAP

In spite of the obvious restrictions due to Covid, FoHA managed to run a robust events programme across the year. Although some events had to be cancelled, we were able to adapt others and add new, Covid-friendly events to fill in the gaps. Overall, we had a successful year, with a mix of both fundraising and community-building events. We were proud to have been able to raise funds and resources for other charities. We didn't allow the pandemic to stop us and were fortunate to have the support of both the school & parents/carers.

We successfully created a way for Harpenden children to celebrate Halloween, in a COVID-secure way. Children located pumpkins along a trail and once all were found returned to HA to receive a bag of treats!

This year COVID guidelines prevented kids from visiting Santa so we created an event that captured the holiday spirit. Children walked the trail to complete a special word then returned to our Grotto to receive a gift from Santa.

Thanks to HA's own magician, Gareth Kalyan, and the organisational skills of Katharine Haines we provided a virtual magic show that was fun for the entire family!

We look forward to completing the Elmer Garden over the coming weeks, adding an additional uniform supplier and introducing a Garden Club for the school. We are also formalising the process for teachers & staff who request FoHA funds support. As the school will celebrate its 10th year in 2022, we will be introducing a new fundraising project that we believe will be life changing for our children and the school. As always, plans and results will be shared at our Open FoHA meetings.




2020-21 TREASURERS REPORT

The accounting year for 2020/21 ended on 30th September 2021. Although the figures included are preliminary, the overall numbers should not materially change. FoHA's operations netted a loss of £3,490 in 2020/21 due to a high level of donations vs revenue. In total £15,215 was donated to the school, of which £7k was for the ICT suite. Even though the pandemic proved difficult for face-to-face events, total profit from events was £12,526 which was a brilliant result for FoHA. As annual revenues were below £25k the accounts don't need to go via the Charity Commission. This was a difficult year for events and raising funds with majority having to take place virtually, however despite the challenges FoHA have managed to rival prior year event profits.

There is currently £7,700 in the account.






